Once again, Mike showed his skill and passion for all things wood-turning. Last month, Mike showed us how to make a lidded candy dish, but many eyes were on

the lazy-susan tool caddy setting on the bench behind him.

If you didn't get to see Mike's lecture on how to make the caddy, check out the video from the club's library or grab Mike and ask him some questions. I'm sure he'll be happy to bring you up to speed. Just don't forget that he is an architect by trade. And the quality of his work shows.

Need something to put in that tool caddy? Bob Speier followed right on Mike's heals with a great demonstration on how to make tool handles. Whether you buy pre-handled or unhandled tools, Bob encourages you to add distinction and a personal feel to all of your tools by turning your own handles.

Brass plumbing fittings are Bob's choice for making the ferrules for the handle—this piece protects against the wood breaking and the tool coming out of

the handle.

Bob prefers using exotic woods, such as cocobolo for his handles and adds a brass cap to the end of the handle.

MSWG MEETING MINUTES FEBRUARY 2006

President Cassandra Speier called the meeting to order at 9:00am by welcoming the members and six visitors.

Prior Meeting Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting posted in the newsletter where amended stating, "which has been sold by past President Hershel Miller." The minutes were unanimously approved.

Committee Reports

Finance: R. McMullen presented the finance report. Motion to approve with second made by club members and the report was unanimously approved. Ryan reported that a copy of the report would always be posted on the club bulletin board during meetings.

Secretary: R. Speier reported that 3 membership renewals were received during February as well as 4 new members. Total membership was now 69 members.

Donations: K. Burns reported WoodChips.com made a very generous donation of woodturning supplies and tools.

Facility Mgmt: M. Kelly reported on the status of our new meeting location. MSWG will enter into a one-year lease with Gameday Sports Academy. Rent is \$100/month for a 4-5 hour meeting.

Other: Exhibitions – R. Speier reported for J. Kelly that Christian Brothers University has accepted our application for a MSWG exhibition which will be held August 20, 2007.

Old Business - Delta Lathe

Cassandra explained to the members that a letter had been drafted requesting the funds from the sale of the "Club Lathe" from Hershel Miller. She explained that all board members were signing the letter and requested members to do so as well if they so choose. The letter would be sent out on Monday, February 27th by registered mail and return receipt requested. Cassandra told the members no further action would be taken unless prompted by Hershel Miller.

Meeting Schedule

Mike Kelly informed the members of the up coming schedule of demonstrations through June 2006. Cassandra also asked the members if changing the meeting to the 2^{nd} Saturday of the month was desirable. A motion was also made to change the meeting back to 9:30am. After much discussion a vote was taken and both topics were declined by a majority vote of the members.

March Professional Turning Demonstration

Mike Kelly informed the members about the upcoming Demo with Michael Mocho from New Mexico to be held on Saturday and Sunday, March 25 and 26.

Cassandra introduced Mike Kelly and Bob Speier as this month's demonstrators. Mike proceeded with an excellent demonstration of his PVC Tool Holder seen by the members the previous meeting. Bob Speier demonstrated how to make custom tool handles utilizing brass plumbing fittings.

The club meeting was adjourned at 12:00 pm after holding a raffle for items donated by members and an auction for a set of tools donated by WoodChips.com. The set of tools brought in \$210 by our new member Billy Tignor.

Shop Shots

Keith Burns

I visited with Keith at his shop on a Sunday Evening and was amazed at his layout. It is a shop that we all dream about. He has plenty of space (20 X 24) and it was clean when I visited. He admitted he had just cleaned it - not for my visit, but it was time for the necessary cleanup.

Keith mostly does segmented work and confessed that he still does some 'flat stuff'. His shop/studio is outfitted to do the work he really enjoys.

Keith currently designs and sells Industrial Dust Collection systems to the Furniture, Hardware Flooring, Cabinet, and Lumber industries. He has been turning about 12 years off and on and has mostly been turning seriously for about 5-1/2 years. You will not believe the dust collection system he has designed for himself.

Keith says, "Although I really dislike the word artist, I consider myself a craftsman. I've always needed a creative outlet. Turning

has provided this outlet for me. However good you may be, you can always improve your skills."

He started out with a \$100 cheap Chinese import. It was a lousy lathe but it did show him that he could turn and that he really liked turning. He now has a Rockwell/Delta 46-450 Variable Speed Lathe that he bought on Ebay and

refurbished himself. It is a great, heavy-duty lathe. He also has a Delta Midi that he can use for pens or with the Beall Buffing System.

Keith joined the Mid South Woodturners Guild in January 2005 and is now a Board Member of the club.

If he had to choose one favorite wood to turn it would be Walnut. However, segmented

work allows him to use a variety of woods like maple and oak. He also has turned all of the exotics.

He is a self-taught turner. That can be good or bad. He had never seen another's work live until he joined the MSGW. He wishes he had joined years ago. Keith had never attended any professional woodworking/wodturning schools or demonstrations until he attended the Bob Rosand demo and that was a real treat. He learns something from every club meeting he attends and it always excites him to see the other member's work. He told me frankly that he is in awe of the quality of work he sees in the instant gallery.

His turning goals: "As I do mostly segmented work, I always use dry wood. I've never turned a piece of green wood. My goal is to someday do a natural edge bowl. I'd also like to learn to more texturing, burning and piercing. I want to improve my overall turning skills."


So...education and fellowship! I say it sounds like a road trip to me! See you in a few weeks!

The ABCs!

Use the ABC's of wood-turning for every cut.

(A)nchor

(B)evel

(C)ut

Anchor the tool to the toolrest first. Touch the Bevel of the tool to the wood next. Move the tool handle into position to Cut last.

Got Sandpaper?

Use sandpaper as if someone else is buying it. Dont be cheap, throw away sandpaper that is old or clogged.

Turning Tips Auto-generator

Turn Fast~ Sand Slow

Turn as fast as is <u>safe</u>. Keep in mind that wood quality, size and shape determine what is considered safe.

Sand at a slow speed for best results.
