Our August meeting will remembered by many who attended as a milestone for MSWG as internationally recognized turning artist Binh Pho shared his talent with us for two days. However, one of our greatest strengths as an organization is the willingness of our own members to share knowledge and ideas with one another. The September meeting will feature our own John Williams, whose enthusiasm for clocks led him to design a miniature street clock ornament that was showcased in Woodturning Design magazine. John has restored and repaired antique clocks for about 40 years, both as a hobby and as a second job. He is retired from the US Department of Agriculture where he was a supervisory chemist. His interest in turning came about as it was needed for other woodworking projects, including clock building. Club member and fellow clock expert Glen Alexander will work along with John to present the program on September 29. They will talk about the use of woodturnings in clock manufacturing through the years and will show some examples of different types of turnings on clocks. The design of the Street Clock Ornament will be discussed and steps for its construction demonstrated. They will also elaborate on the experience of producing the article for Woodturning Design magazine.
