

Oktoberfest

Joel will employ the Stubby lathe to demo something BIG. Normally we have time and size constraints, but Oktoberfest will allow for a larger scale demo. Dennis Paullus has offered to man the chainsaw to demonstrate the cutting of logs into blanks for various projects. Custom cut blanks will be available for those attending, but please be prepared to offer a suitable tip for the wood. Remember, this timber has been cut, loaded, and transported before it is touched by the chainsaw on site. \$4.00 or \$5.00 is suggested as an appropriate tip for a blank cut to your specifications.

Meanwhile, there will be two rotations of additional demonstrations. Kicking off the morning, Dennis will demonstrate threading while Bill Shaw shows the technique of cutting spirals. The second half of the morning will include Rick Gillespie with a surprise up his sleeve and Larry Sefton showing how to make a wood burner with custom formed brands. Lunch will be fried catfish, courtesy of Bob Speier.

As if that is not enough, the afternoon session will continue the tradition of a turning challenge. Members will not want to miss this, as Bob and Sandi Speier take over the mini lathes in friendly matrimonial competition with

wood blanks supplied by Dennis.

Don't forget to bring lawn chairs. The carvers and woodworkers clubs have responded enthusiastically to our invitation to join us. October 18, 9:00 until about 3:00.



President's Corner

I hope you are looking forward to Oktoberfest as much as I am. It is always a great, fun-filled day. It does not get much better than to have a day with friends, learning more about your favorite hobby, and topping it off with good food being cooked by Bob Speier. WOW! Remember, we are meeting one week earlier than usual - Saturday, October 18th.

MSWG needs to take a moment to celebrate our successes so far this year:

- Nine successful general meetings with attendance ranging from a low of 35 to one meeting with 60+ so far this year and a full schedule planned into 2009.
- All but one general meeting has had over 40 and four meetings have had over 50 in attendance.
- Increase in membership from 76 paid members at the end of 2007 to, as of September 30, 2008, 83 paid members.
- Meetings moved to a new location.
- One outside-professional weekend demonstration with two youth in attendance.
- Inaugural pieces juried into the new MSWG Collection at Christian Brothers University through the Beverly & Sam Ross Gallery (additional pieces to be added in future years). This is an outstanding accomplishment - completed thanks to the efforts of many people.
- Two days of successful public demonstrations at Delta Festival.
- One day of successful public demonstrations at Bartlett Festival.
- Establishment of Hartville Tool Club Discount Program.
- Successfully obtaining an EOG (Educational

Opportunity Grant) of \$1,200 from AAW.

- Addition of video clips to our website.
- Japanese Bowls, a Memphis Perspective (great club involvement).
- 8 great issues of *Turner's Talk* (our newsletter)
- MSWG's immediate-past president is running for an AAW board position.
- Several successful open shop tours held.
- Improvements to the MSWG resource library.

Your MSWG board of directors, with your help, has made this happen. As per our bylaws we have three to four MSWG board directors opening each year. **Please** volunteer and add your name to the ballot for 2009. As a reminder from our bylaws:

“ARTICLE VII – OFFICERS

A. Board of Directors: Directors shall be elected for a term of two years. Terms of office will be staggered to enhance continuity. Three Directors will be elected in odd numbered years and four Directors will be elected in even numbered years. Term Limitations shall limit Directors and Board Members to no more than two consecutive terms of two years each. A past Director or Board Member may run for a position on the board after a one-year hiatus.” General Members “in good standing with AAW” and a willingness to serve are eligible to seek the office of Director.

Elections shall normally be held in November and newly elected Directors shall assume office at the January meeting.

Directors shall be elected by a majority vote of those General Members casting ballots at a scheduled meeting or who have sent written ballots to be opened at such meeting. Elections shall have been announced at a preceding meeting and through an advance mailing to the membership. *Continued on pg 3*

B. Officers: Officers will be elected by the Board of Directors from among the Directors. The Board of Directors shall normally meet each month to conduct and oversee planning and other business. All members in good standing are eligible to attend meetings but only Directors are eligible to cast votes."

Treasurer's Financial Report:

General Fund- \$1919.51; Educational Fund- \$752.04; Account was posted on the announcement board.

Dave Hout's demonstration total cost \$1,854; fees collected \$860, AAW Grant \$960, net loss of (\$34). After receiving the remaining AAW Grant of \$240 there will be a profit of \$206. Account detail numbers were made available to general membership.

- Bill McMillen, Librarian - Reminded everyone about the library, Bill thanked Larry Sefton for the donation of a video DVD by Trent Bosch. - Volunteer needed for shop tour for November.
- Hartville Tool Club Member Discount Program - was reviewed, catalogs passed out and a reminder of the 20% member discount the first year and 15% in remaining years.
- Reviewed the success of the Delta Fair and that we look forward to doing this again next year. Everyone was encouraged to enter the arts/crafts competition.
- 2009 Board nomination - There are three and maybe four board openings for 2009 as board members terms expire. We are in need of nominations and please contact anyone on the MSWG board.


