

Finishing Your Art

If you attended the August meeting, you may remember Larry Sefton's bold red Christmas tree ornament with the pierced band on the hollow sphere. Many of us, including our guest demonstrator who reviewed the instant gal-



Larry, a MSWG member for two years, turned his first piece at the age of 13, a belt pulley for a kit winder. Other things occupied his time until 2003 when he took a pen turning class and purchased a Jet mini lathe. After a class at John C. Campbell Folk School in 2004, he bought a Powermatic 3520. He has continued to expand his turning knowledge with classes at Campbell and has won awards at the Mid-South Fair. The work of Frank Sudol and Bihn Pho inspired him to learn to use dyes and other non-traditional finishes.



Larry's presentation will cover processes that he has discovered to make holly look really white, remove wood color and prepare wood for dyes and stains, to ebonize wood, plus an easy dyeing process. He will also talk about how to make a piece feel very smooth and the effects of different finishes on wood. He has

created a materials list as well as other pertinent handouts.

Rounding out the morning will be a slide show of highlights of the recent AAW National Symposium in Louisville, Kentucky. Ryan McMullen, MSWG treasurer, will be our tour guide with his collection of photos. Don't miss it!







MSWG MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 26, 2006

The meeting was brought to order by President Cassandra Speier at approximately 9:00 am. Cassandra welcomed the members in attendance as well as Joe Ruminski the featured Demonstrator.

Agenda Topics:

Cassandra asked for approval of the prior general meeting minutes that had been posted in the newsletter. A motion to approve was made and seconded with subsequent approval.

New Business:

Cassandra graciously thanked Mike for his devoted help over the years and presented him with a memento turned by Michael Mocho. Mike briefly explained his future plans and thanked the members.

Cassandra explained to the members the changes being made to the board, which included Chuck Ludwigsen being moved to the 1st VP position and Keith Burns being moved to the 2nd VP position. Matt Garner will fill the open Board Member position.

Demonstration:

Cassandra introduced Joe Ruminski from the North Carolina Woodturners as the weekend's demonstrator.

The attendance on Saturday was 37, with 27 returning on Sunday.

Jim retired from Banking after working in various positions at the Detroit Bank and Trust (now the Comerica Bank) for 32 years. He has been turning since 1996 and he says the greatest influence and deciding factor for him to continue turning was Dana Curtis*, one of the founding members of the Mid South Woodturners Guild.

Jim's first lathe was a Delta 4 speed model and he now has an old Delta variable speed model 46-541P with outboard turning capabilities.

Jim joined the Mid South Woodturners Guild about 1997-1998. He says he doesn't have a favorite wood and he turns all kinds. I saw his gallery and I can attest to that statement. He says he would like to go to various symposiums around the country and see different demonstrations to change his turning path somewhat.

Jim took an Intermediate turning course at Craft Supplies at Millers Dale near Buxton Derbyshire England with Jimmy Clews, several years ago as well as another course in the South of England with a member of the English Turning Guild. He also spent a little time with Alexandra James Mutch, a well known turner, in Scotland last year. He, it turns out, has influenced his work quite a bit.

He doesn't have any specific goals, but will probably spend more time on vases and hollow vessels.

early 1960's he studied with several English turners, among them a Mr. Peter Childs. Mr. Childs was sort of the 'Father of Modern Turning' at the time. Dana became a 'disciple' of Childs. He was also shown the value of the English turning chisels as well as holding devices. He imported all of that material and started to teach woodturning as well as woodcarving. He also started the Memphis Arts and Craft Assn., known as MACA, here along with a Mrs. Mimi Dann."


