For me, the biggest learning/reminder was how to control tool bouncing while turning. It seems counter intuitive that bouncing is caused by pushing the gouge too hard against the piece while turning versus barely holding the bevel against the piece while cutting. Riding the bevel with a light tough makes a huge difference. For our June meeting, the demonstration is by our own Sam Dawson showing how to stabilize wood and turn bird calls. 

P.S. Maybe this could be a future President's Challenge!?!





Our May meeting featured Trent Bosch via an IRD - Interactive Remote Demonstration.

In this version of his popular, decorative utility bowl-demo, he added instructions to show a technique he uses to expand the possibilities of a utility piece, to make it more decorative.

Drawing inspiration from his environment in Colorado (with all its prominent mountains) he modified his interpretation of the calabash bowl. This demo took us through making the bowl, beading the bowl, laying out and carving the mountain ranges. During all this, he still found time to includ instruction on wood prep, tool sharpening, finishing and a myriad of other techniques.

Trent is known for presenting a well though-out and professional demo - and we received nothing less.

If you were unable to attend the meeting, Trent allowed us remote access to a recording of the IRD for a month. Access to members-only is available via an email sent to all by Secretary Larry Sefton. Check your email for June 14, which contains the needed password.


